ex·treme

1. of a character farthest removed from the ordinary
2. exceedingly great in degree
3. farthest from the center or middle
4. very far in any direction
5. exceeding the bounds of moderation

How will we measure up when we're called to account??


EXTREME DISCIPLESHIP

- *Justice*
- *Steadfast Love*
- *Humility*

This passage was written long before Jesus (approx 750 BCE)
During massive economic and religious changes, and under threat of invasion.
Points out three virtues of discipleship ch 6:8
Not much more extreme than that???

Extreme Virtues that are '*requirements*' of God's People:

- Justice - Justice for the poor involves our social, professional, and economic relationships, as well as our personal relationships.
- Steadfast Love - loving-kindness in all of our relationships, with strangers, friends, loved ones, and God, despite "the changeableness of religious feelings" or of our emotions toward other people.
- Humility - True humility makes justice and mercy possible. When we oppress and mistreat others, we act as though we are superior to them in a fundamental way. In truth, we are utterly dependent; "our talents, our opportunities, our material resources, our loved ones, are all gifts from God."



All these are inter-twined, cannot and should not be separated
We cannot be loving without humility
We cannot be Just without humility
And we cannot be humble while we lack integrity or hate others
These together make a Divine Life that's not attainable unless we are committed to God

How does this fit with The Beatitudes in Matthew reading?
Is this just a re-telling of Micah 6:8 in more detail? Or possibly a bit more guidance to explain how each fits
Look at 'Blessed' (some translations are 'Joy') - this means an **active** involvement of being happy in the 'right thing' that you are doing
"Happiness cannot be grasped – but it can be found, it can be received, it can be lived" Rev Jock Stein, retired Minister, Church of Scotland
Look at the blessings in V3-9

- ***poor in spirit***
- ***mourn the hurt***
- ***meek***
- ***passion for righteousness***
- ***merciful***
- ***pure in heart***
- ***peacemakers***

These are the Qualities and Experiences combined in the ideal character (JD Douglas & MC Tenney, 1989)

See how they fit with the 3 virtues in Micah

<i>poor in spirit</i>	Acknowledge our own helplessness, rely on God not ourselves	humility
<i>mourn the hurt</i>	Sharing the hurt and sin of the world, rejection of Christ	Love / humility
<i>meek</i>	Acceptance of our lowly position	humility
<i>passion for righteousness</i>	Honesty, integrity, justice in society, practical application of 'holiness'	justice
<i>merciful</i>	Actively compassionate	love
<i>pure in heart</i>	Motives are un-mixed, thoughts are holy, conscience is clear	Justice / love
<i>peacemakers</i>	Actively intervene to make peace, positive action to create peace	Justice / love

This is often not what the world view is - business/profit; career/promotion; problem/blame

Not the 'look after yourself' approach

Does take practice - lots of it


Change the 'what's in it for me' and see the 'what's in it for everyone'

It's not Rocket Science, but often seems more difficult just to do the 'right thing'

And we will be despised and ridiculed for this
But the rewards are enormous
JOY / HAPPINESS / SECURITY
(read psalm 15 again)

I had an email forwarded some time ago - it reminds us that we are part of the whole picture and we need to look out for each other.

The young boy was apologetic.


'Please, mister....please, I'm sorry but I didn't know what else to do,' He pleaded.


